State Emergency Service Life Membership



On Sunday December Jason Robins received Life Membership with the SES.

Jason commenced as a volunteer member with the Tasmania State Emergency Service in 1994. ioinina the Southern Midlands SES Unit and becoming the

Southern Midlands SES Unit Manager in 2008.

Jason is a highly experienced SES member that has obtained considerable skills in the road crash rescue. general rescue, storm response, and roping and land search areas. He is also an experienced unit trainer and assists in regional training activities. He has volunteered his time to assist SES Regional Staff train other units in road crash rescue and chainsaw operations.

Jason was awarded the Emergency Services Medal (ESM) in 2021, an award that recognises those that have rendered distinguished service as a member of an Australian emergency service.

Jason has demonstrated superior dedication and community to the Tasmanian State Emergency Service, and to the community during his career of over 30 years.

Do you like platypus? Then get rid of the introduced weed Cumbungi!

Life in the wild for the average Tasmanian platypus can be challenging. Setting aside the usual causes of mortality including disease, dogs and cats, discarded litter, illegal fishing/traps, and being run over by vehicles. Platypus are also vulnerable to habitat loss and degradation.

If you are lucky enough to have long creeks on your land with pools, suitable banks, good riparian (stream side) vegetation and flowing water, you should have platypus as residents. If however, you allow the introduced bulrush/cumbungi (Typha latifolia) to infest your dams and waterways, eventually there will not be any platypus in your creek. Think about it; platypus need to be able to dive and filter the stream beds to feed. If they can't even get into the water due to wall-to-wall cumbungi, then that stretch of waterway is not suitable habitat for this animal.

Even if you don't have platypus in your waterways, please consider doing Cumbungi control to improve habitat for other animals. Cumbungi will grow in water to around 2m deep and it will rapidly take over the entire surface of the water (especially in areas without shade). Cut off all leaves to below water level, and do that a few times each summer to keep them at bay.

Oatlands Village Square Development Creating a Vibrant Civic and Cultural Heart

Readers will recall that the Oatlands Structure Plan (Sept 2021) supported the community view in the development of a civic square in Oatlands as a focal point in the Village and that it should be in front of Roche Hall and connected to the Council Chambers site.

We have a once in a century opportunity to reimagine the area to create a new focal point and heart of the Village, for residents and visitors alike. It will reinforce the status of Oatlands as the preeminent historic Georgian village in Australia and also builds on our emerging reputation as a centre of cultural significance.



A Project Inception Meeting was held on the 11 December 2024, to scope the project and understand the implications of other peripheral issues that would likely impact on the Village Square development. These issues include: remedying the poor geometry of Stutzer Street (in providing access to the side entrance of the Council Chamber); disability parking; and should Stutzer Street be 'cut off' between High Street and the side entrance to the Council Chambers. It is early days and we need to work through all such matters by researching options and also understanding community expectations.

It was a strong view of the meeting that community consultation is core to the success of the project. The first part of the consultation will be flagging all of the issues and seeking your views on a way forward. We have allowed a considerable amount of time for the overall research and design process. We are looking at June 2026 as the extent of the project design/consultation timeline.

It is crucial that we are extremely sensitive with the design to ensure that we honour and respect our wonderful Georgian Village with this proposed civic and cultural space.

Our Team are looking forward to a partnership with the community in creating this significant focal point. Carpe Diem.
